

CONSENT FOR OFF LABEL USE OF IBANDRONATE INJECTION INTO THE FEMORAL HEAD BONE

This additional consent is specifically for the use of Ibandronate. Dr. Prasad Gourineni, MD has explained to me that

1. Ibandronate is approved by the F.D.A. for oral and intravenous injection for osteoporosis.
2. Use of Ibandronate for avascular necrosis is not an F.D.A. approved indication.
3. Injection of Ibandronate into the bone is not an approved route of administration.
4. The full risks/benefits of bone injection of Ibandronate are not known.
5. In addition to the side effects of intravenous Ibandronate, the bone injection can cause local pain, bleeding, infection, and other unknown complications.
